Catherine de' Medici (1589–1519)

Among the most intriguing names in our culture is that of the powerful de' Medici Family. The Renaissance (1400 A.D. – 1700 A.D.) was a period of time in Europe that was regarded as the cultural bridge between the Middle Ages and modern history. It started in Italy as a cultural movement in the Late Medieval period and later spread throughout Europe, marking the beginning of the Early Modern Age. There is a consensus that the Renaissance began in Florence in the 14th century. The theories focus on a variety of factors including the social and civic peculiarities of Florence at the time: its political structures; the patronage of its

dominant family, the Medici's, and other factors.

Catherine ("Caterina") was born in Florence, Italy on April 13, 1519 when the Medici family at that time were the de facto rulers of Florence. The family were originally bankers, and came into great wealth and power by bankrolling the monarchies of Europe. Her father, Lorenzo II de' Medici, was made Duke of Urbino by his uncle, Pope Leo. Catherine's mother, Madeleine de Tour d'Auvergne, the Countess of Boulogne, was from one of the most prominent and ancient French noble families. This prestigious maternal heritage was of benefit to Catherine's future marriage to a French prince.


Both of Catherine's parents died at an early age. She was first cared for by her grandmother. After her grandmother's death in 1520, she was raised by her aunt for a short time and eventually entered several convents. The final convent was her home for three years and were described as "the happiest of her entire life."

At age 14 Catherine married Prince Henry, second son of King Francis I and Queen Claude of France. The wedding was a grand affair, but unfortunately, the nineteen year old Prince Henry showed no interest in Catherine as a wife; instead, he openly took mistresses, one of whom he adored for the remainder of his rather short life. Her name was Diane de Poitiers, who was 38 years old. Even in the presence of royal guests, Henry would often sit on Diane's lap and play the guitar, chat about politics and unabashedly exhibit his affection and love for her.

Henry's older brother, King Francis, contracted a fever and died in 1536, leaving Henry the heir who then became King Henri II; hence Catherine became the Queen of France. For the first ten years of their marriage, Catherine failed to have any children, however in 1537, one of Henry's mistresses gave birth to a daughter, whom he publicly acknowledged, thus proving that Henry was fertile and this added to the pressure on Catherine to produce a child. Catherine was now expected to provide a future heir to the throne. In desperation, Catherine tried every known trick at that time for getting pregnant and on January 19, 1544, she at last gave birth to a son, and the child was named after King Francis.

After becoming pregnant once, Catherine had no trouble doing so again and went on to bear Henry a total of ten children, six of whom survived infancy. Catherine's new-found ability to bear children, however, failed to improve her marriage. Henry allowed her almost no political influence as Queen. Although she sometimes acted as regent during his absences from France, her powers were strictly nominal. His mistress, Diane de Poitiers took her place at the center of power, dispensing



In 1559, Kin Henry's face was shattered in a jousting match, leaving wooden splinters sticking out of his eye and head. He had five of the splinters extracted from his head, however one had pierced his eye and brain. Catherine, the dutiful wife, stayed by his bedside and Diane kept away from the King, "for fear of being expelled by the Queen" in the words of a chronicler. For the next ten days, Henry's state of health fluctuated. At times he even felt well enough to dictate letters and listen to music. Gradually he lost his sight, speech, and reason and on July 10th he died. From that day onward, Catherine took a broken lance as her emblem. She wore black clothing until the end of her life and took on the persona of a grieving widow. Her emblem was inscribed with the following translation: "from this come my tears and my pain").

Catherine's life took many more twists and turns during her remaining years, especially while her young sons reined as King. Before she died on January 5, 1589, she had established herself as a patron of architecture, having many structures built, most of which unfortunately were destroyed in the Religious Wars. Few survived, among them, the monuments built for the Valois Chapel where the tomb of Catherine and Henry remain. Some of her projects survived, including several monuments built for the Valois Chapel where the tomb of Catherine and Henry are located, which was declared "the last and most brilliant of the royal tombs of the Renaissance" by art historian Henri Zerner. A plethora of information exists on the internet if you are so inclined to delve further into the life of this fascinating woman.


Italian Club Cemetery, & to the Krewe of Italia. The food was scrumptious and the camaraderie superb!

Shakespeare's star-crossed lovers find themselves trapped in the deadly Montague-Capulet family feud. Defying family honor, they choose each other, taking their lives into their own hands. Forget the fairy godmother and glimmering glass slipper ... this comedic turn on the cinder-tending heroine of the classic folktale features Cenerentola ("chenneh-REN-to-lah"), as Cinderella is known in Italian. 

We are excited to everyone of our 2017 Festa Italiana Tampa Scholarship sponsored in honor of Nelson Italiano. This is our sixteenth year offering this \$5,000.00 scholarship to area high school seniors. Here are the criteria:

- 1. Be a high school senior graduating in the Spring of 2017 at a Hillsborough County public or private high school.




